

Land Development Code Update

Tentative Meeting Schedule

The Prineville Planning Commission will be reviewing the entire Land Development Code over the next two years. In an effort to encourage public involvement throughout the entire process, the Planning Commission will hold public input meetings for each section of the code.

There are two types of meetings, described as follows:

Public Input and Discussion Meetings – These are meetings in which City staff will guide the Planning Commission, Public Input Committee and other participating community members through a review of the existing code section. The primary objective of these meetings is to identify problems and deficiencies in the existing code and to generate ideas to improve it.

Public Workshops (PW) – These are meetings in which City staff will present a draft of a specific code section, which will be created based on input from the public input meetings. The Planning Commission, Public Input Committee and other participating citizens will discuss the draft and propose changes.

Basically, public input meetings are for generating ideas to improve the Land Development Code while public workshops are for developing the actual code language.

The following is a tentative schedule for reviewing the Land Development Code. All meetings are on Tuesday nights and will start at 5:30 and take place in the Council Chambers at Prineville City Hall.

This represents approximately one-third of the entire Land Development Code. A tentative schedule for reviewing the rest of the code will be published once staff is able to evaluate how quickly the Planning Commission will be able to work through the zone sections listed above.
