Improvements and additions at Meadow Lakes Golf Course:

Menu with phone number placed in power carts for easy ordering while on course.

Air compressor placed at clubhouse for golfer's convenience (cleaning golf shoes, pull carts, inflating tires, etc.).

New Smithco roller from RMT Company purchased to improve quality and consistency of putting surfaces.

Video monitors placed in office and kitchen to watch for customers in bar area. Able to offer more timely service to patrons while completing other tasks.

Improved public address system for starting players off both #1 & #10 tees throughout the year.

Two windmills placed on golf course to improve water quality in lakes, (Lake by Hole #1 & #10).

Reader boards placed on course advertising food specials, breakfast items available etc., in the restaurant as well as golf promotions in the Golf Shop such as Super Twi-Light after 4pm.

Full support of Ladies & Men's Golf Associations in an effort to help promote play at the golf course.

Added new entrance on west side of clubhouse for easier access to the restaurant which keeps golfers from walking through the banquet room while a conference or meeting is in progress and out of the flower beds.

New drainage (French drain) along the edge of cart paths, resetting of irrigation heads so they work properly, and new trees planted on golf course.

Monitoring of soft and hard good inventories in the Golf Shop to match spending habits of customers.

This is a snapshot view of many things taking place at Meadow Lakes Golf Course in an ongoing effort to improve service and increase use of the facility by our patrons. As rounds of golf are increased dependence on the city for financial support will continue to decrease. Meadow Lakes is an outstanding facility that is available to its citizens, while at the same time addressing the waste water issues of the City of Prineville.
