Visitors, Appearances and Requests:

A. Humane Society Update

Tom MacDonald came forward and provided an update of the Humane Society's activities and accomplishments over the last year. There were questions.

B. Prineville Disposal

Steve Holliday came forward with the annual franchise check and provided a disposal update.

Mr. Holliday discussed the fireworks plan for the 4^{th} of July celebration.

A. Proclamation - Poppy Days

Mayor Roppe read the proclamation into the record and then read additional information regarding the history behind the poppy.

Staff Reports:

A. Managers Report – Steve Forrester

Steve Forrester asked Eric Klann, City Engineer to provide an update on the test well to the Council.

Mr. Klann came forward explaining that the first test well would have been the 2nd best well for the city, the second test well drilled, performed significantly better at over 1000 gpm.

Mr. Forrester continued the Manager's report stating that: Brian Harmon will be starting as the new PW Superintendent on June 4th; Jerry Brummer's last official day will be June 30th, however Mr. Brummer will be putting his knowledge to use by getting the city's entire infrastructure inventoried and mapped.

Mr. Brummer came forward and explained how this would be done.

Mr. Forrester closed the Manager's report with inviting everyone to the Crook County Cohort #1 event at Meadow Lakes and asking Mayor Roppe to provide an update on the DC trip.

Mayor Roppe provided an update for what Brian Barney of Ochocco Irrigation District and she had done while in DC.

B. Intent to Award 2012 Influent Pump Screen
