The Prineville Police Department has in its possession several weapons. These weapons have either been forfeited by the courts to the state, turned over to the department as found property or items that have had a 30 day certified letter sent to the owner with no response. I am proposing that these weapons be turned over to the Prineville Police department to be used as they see fit. Please see case #'s below for further information.

Case # 15000235 – 22 Ruger .22 MAG – Item forfeited by the courts to the state (PPD) owner notified

Case # 15001748 – Rifle – District Attorney released on the item, a 30 day certified letter was sent to owner with no response

Case # 15001269 – Double barrel shotgun 12 gauge – item was listed as found property with this case due to suspect not claiming. No owner ever claimed item

Case # 16000548 – Ruger 10-22 Rifle – item was submitted as a safekeeping item. Owner did not return within 30 days to claim item.

Case # 09001262 – Ruger 10-22 Rifle – item was released by the District Attorney several years ago. A certified letter was sent to owner by past evidence technicians. Owner did not respond to letter

Case # 13001240 –Taurus 40 Cal - District Attorney released on the item, 30 day certified letter was sent to owner, owner contacted the PPD evidence technician and was advised of necessary steps to retrieve item. Owner did not follow through/complete steps within time frame. Item now belongs to PPD.

Case # 13001240 – High point handgun .380 cal & Curio 6mm – both released by District Attorney – 30 day letter sent to owner to make arrangements to pick up items, letter was undeliverable, unable to locate better address for owner.
