

ORDINANCE NO. 864

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 829, REGULATING THE DELIVERY OF PETROLEUM FUELS FOR RETAIL SALE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The People of the City of Prineville ordain as follows:

1. Section 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2.

- (7) The operator of vehicle shall have with him, free and ready for use, a dry-chemical type fire extinguisher having at a minimum a 20-pound capacity and a 10-A: 80-B:C classification or the equivalent.
- (8) All fuel delivery vehicles in excess of 2,500 gallon capacity shall utilize the gravity drop method of delivery and delivery vehicle engine shall not be running.


Delivery vehicles with a capacity of 2,500 gallons or less shall adhere to Article 15, Section 15.1104 of the "Uniform Fire Code" when making deliveries.


2. All other sections of Ordinance No. 829 shall remain in full force and effect.

3. Inasmuch as it is necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the City of Prineville that this ordinance go into effect immediately after its passage, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
