

ORDINANCE NO. 865

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH CHARGES FOR THE USE OF THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE AMBULANCE, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 784; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The People of the City of Prineville ordain as follows:

Section 1. Charges for use of the City of Prineville ambulance shall be in accordance with the following schedules:

Within Crook County

City ResidentsBase Rate \$50.00 plus \$4.00 per mile one way
Non-City Residents . .Base Rate \$70.00 plus \$4.00 per mile one way

Long Distance Transfers:

Bend:

City Residents. \$150.00 Flat Rate
Non-City Residents. \$175.00 Flat Rate

Redmond:

City Residents \$110.00 Flat Rate
Non-City Residents. \$130.00 Flat Rate

Madras:

City Residents. \$140.00 Flat Rate
Non-City Residents. \$160.00 Flat Rate

Portland, Eugene, Salem:

City Residents. \$350.00 Flat Rate
Non-City Residents. \$375.00 Flat Rate

Long distance transfers to a destination other than listed above shall be charged at the rate of \$50.00 or \$70.00 for City or Non-City residents, respectively, plus \$4.00 per mile one way.

Standby Time

Standby time at hospitals or clinics while waiting for patients to have tests shall be charged at the rate of \$60.00 per hour, to be figured in 10 minute increments.

Sporting Event Standby

(1) Tax-Supported Event (Football games, etc.)- \$30.00 base charge, plus \$5.00 per hour standby time, with base charge going to City and hourly charge going to Volunteer Ambulance Drivers' Fund.

(2) Non-Tax Supported Event (Rodeos, Horse Races, Horse Shows, etc.)-\$50.00 base charge plus \$10.00 per hour standby time, with base charge going to City and hourly charge going to Volunteer Ambulance Drivers' Fund. Mileage to an out-of-community event (e.g. Paulina Rodeo) will be charged at the rate of \$4.00 per mile one way in addition to the base rate and hourly charge.


Section 2. Should there be a continuation-type transfer (e.g. person transported to Pioneer Memorial Hospital, then later transported to an out-of-town hospital) the rates for WITHIN CROOK COUNTY shall not apply, but said transfer shall be charged at the long-distance transfer rates, only, providing said continuation occurs within 12 hours of the original transport to a local medical facility.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 784 is hereby repealed in its entirety.



Inasmuch as it is necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the City of Prineville that this ordinance go into effect immediately after its passage, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
