## ORDINANCE NO. 1022

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 911, SECTION 33, RELATIVE TO OPEN BURNING AND BURN BARRELS.

Section 33 of Ordinance No. 911 is amended to read as follows:

Section 33. Open Burning and Burn Barrels.

- A person must obtain a permit for burning debris piles. These debris piles shall be limited to include limbs, dry leaves, shrubs and household wood products, only. A person shall not burn any paper products in burning piles. A pile shall not exceed 4 feet in height and 6 feet in diameter.
- 2) A person must obtain an annual permit and may burn only in-barrel during prescribed hours and can burn dry paper, dry limbs and dry wood products, only. Barrels must be covered with no larger than a 1/4 inch screen and both screen and barrel must be maintained in good condition with no holes or rust rot.
- 3) Fire Safety: No burning shall take place within 10 feet of combustibles, structure or property lines. The fire must be attended at all times of burning, and the person must maintain control of their fire with water and fire fighting tools available.
  - 4) Times for Burning:

Burning Barrels:	7 AM-6 PM 7 AM-12 Noon	October through April May through September
Burn Piles	7 AM-6 PM 7 AM-12 Noon Prohibited	November through April The month of May June-October

- 5) Burning Prohibited: All burning may be prohibited in the event of high to extreme fire danger or danger to air quality, as determined by the fire department. In addition, no burning shall be allowed on Sundays and holidays, except for Christmas Day and New Year's Day.
- 6) Fees: There will be a one time \$10 permit fee for Burn Barrels or Open Burning. The Burn Barrel permit must be renewed annually, with no charge for renewal.

7) Fines and Penalties:

lst offense \$25 fine \$50 fine and revocation of permit 2nd offense for one year. \$100 fine and revocation of per-mit and removal of barrel. 3rd offense 4th or subsequent offense fine not to exceed \$1,000.
