

RESOLUTION NO. 611

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL ELECTIONS TO BE HELD ACCORDING TO THE STATUTES OF THE STATE OF OREGON AND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADOPTING OR REJECTING A LEVY OF \$86,897 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; A LEVY OF \$47,103 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; A LEVY OF \$14,942 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; A LEVY OF \$30,370 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; A LEVY OF \$6,900 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; A LEVY OF \$11,494 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; A LEVY OF \$2,299 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; A LEVY OF \$54,750 OUTSIDE THE PRESENT TAX BASE; PROVIDING FOR THE BALLOT TITLES, WHICH SHALL CONTAIN A CAPTION, QUESTION AND EXPLANATION CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND PLACE OF THE ELECTIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF THE ELECTION.

THE CITY OF PRINEVILLE RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Special elections to provide for a vote on an "A" ballot for Police Personnel in the amount of \$86,897 and "B" ballots for the following areas and amounts:

1) Police Department Personnel	\$47,103
2) Dog and Vector Control	\$14,942
3) Fire and Ambulance Reserve Funds, Personnel and Capital Outlay	\$30,370
4) Solar Heating System - Swim Pool	\$ 6,900
5) Planning Department	\$11,494
6) Chamber of Commerce	\$ 2,299
7) Street Maintenance	\$54,750

all to be one-year special levies, shall be held and are hereby called to be held in the City of Prineville, Crook County, Oregon, on Tuesday, September 20, 1983. These amounts are outside the present tax base.

Section 2. The ballot titles under which these proposals shall appear are as follows:

51. POLICE PERSONNEL LEVY - "A" BALLOT - 1983-84 FISCAL YEAR

QUESTION: Shall the City of Prineville levy \$86,897 outside its tax base for police personnel in the 1983-84 fiscal year?

EXPLANATION: In the 1982-83 fiscal year, the City of Prineville's police force consisted of nine officers, including the Chief of Police, and six dispatchers. In the current year, fiscal 1983-84, only four of the nine officers and five of the six dispatchers are funded inside the City's tax base. Funds for the other five officers and one dispatcher are outside the tax base and must be approved by the voters. If this "A" ballot of \$86,897 is approved, it would provide funding for three of these officers and the one dispatcher and provide a police force level of seven officers - again including the Chief - and six dispatchers. Funds for the other two officers will be voted upon in a separate "B" ballot at this same election.

If this measure is approved, \$86,897 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be financed partially by the State of Oregon.

52. POLICE PERSONNEL LEVY - "B" BALLOT - 1983-84 FISCAL YEAR

QUESTION: Shall the City of Prineville levy \$47,103 outside its tax base for police personnel in the 1983-84 fiscal year?

EXPLANATION: If this "B" ballot for \$47,103 is approved, it will provide funding for two police officers in the 1983-84 fiscal year and allow the Prineville Police Department to maintain the same staffing level of police officers as in the 1982-83 fiscal year - nine officers. Passage of this "B" ballot is contingent upon passage of the separate "A" ballot for the City of Prineville being voted upon at this same election.

If this measure is approved, \$47,103 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial State payment.

53. DOG AND VECTOR CONTROL LEVY - "B" BALLOT - 1983-84 FISCAL YEAR

QUESTION: Shall City of Prineville levy \$14,942 outside its tax base for Dog and Vector (mosquito) control in 1983-84 fiscal year?

EXPLANATION: If this "B" ballot for \$14,942 is approved, it will provide the funding necessary to reinstate Dog Control for the remainder of the 1983-84 fiscal year and funding for Vector Control (mosquito control) in the latter half of the 1983-84 fiscal year. Passage of this "B" ballot is contingent upon passage of the separate "A" ballot for the City of Prineville being voted upon at this same election.

If this measure is approved, \$14,942 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial State payment.

54. FIRE/AMBULANCE LEVY - "B" BALLOT - 1983-84 FISCAL YEAR

QUESTION: Shall City of Prineville levy \$30,370 outside its tax base for Fire/Ambulance reserve funds, personnel, capital outlay, Fiscal 1983-84?

EXPLANATION: If this "B" ballot for \$30,370 is approved, it will allow the City to provide funds for the following: (1) Transfers to reserve funds (for future purchase of equipment) Fire - \$7,500 and Ambulance - \$10,000; (2) Secretarial help (1/2 time) - \$5,000; (3) Capital purchase, Fire Department - \$2,000; (4) Capital purchase, Ambulance Department - \$1,895. Passage of this "B" ballot is contingent upon passage of the separate "A" ballot for the City being voted upon at this same election.

If this measure is approved, \$30,370 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial State payment.

55. SOLAR HEATING SYSTEM LEVY - "B" BALLOT - 1983-84 FISCAL YEAR

QUESTION: Shall City of Prineville levy \$6,900 outside its tax base for lease payment on solar heating system at swimming pool?

EXPLANATION: In order to install a solar heating system at the City swimming pool, a five-year lease agreement was entered into by the City for the solar system. If this "B" ballot of \$6,900 is approved, it would provide funding for payment of the dollars due in the 2nd year of this lease agreement. Passage of this "B" ballot is contingent upon passage of the separate "A" ballot for the City of Prineville being voted upon at this election.

If this measure is approved, \$6,900 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial State payment.

56. PLANNING DEPARTMENT LEVY - "B" BALLOT - 1983-84 FISCAL YEAR

QUESTION: Shall City of Prineville levy \$11,494 outside its tax base for partial support of City-County Planning Department, Fiscal 1983-84?

EXPLANATION: The City of Prineville and Crook County have a joint City-County Planning Department. If this levy of \$11,494 is approved, it would provide a portion of the dollars needed

by the City as its share of the funds needed to operate the joint department. Passage of this levy is contingent upon passage of the separate "A" ballot being voted upon at this same election.

If this measure is approved, \$11,494 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial State payment.

57. FUNDS FOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE LEVY - "B" BALLOT - FISCAL 1983-84?

QUESTION: Shall City of Prineville levy \$2,299 outside its tax base for contribution to Chamber of Commerce, Fiscal Year 1983-84?

EXPLANATION: In the past, the City of Prineville has contributed dollars to the Prineville-Crook County Chamber of Commerce for promotion of the Community. In order to do so again this year, tax dollars are needed. If this "B" ballot of \$2,299 is approved, it will provide the funding for the City's proposed contribution to the Chamber in fiscal 1983-84. Passage of this measure is contingent upon passage of the separate "A" ballot for the City of Prineville being voted upon at this election.

If this measure is approved, \$2,299 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial State payment.

58. STREETS OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE LEVY, 1983-84 FISCAL YEAR

QUESTION: Shall City of Prineville levy \$54,750 outside its tax base for Streets operations and maintenance, Fiscal Year 1983-84?

EXPLANATION: In order to provide operations and maintenance \$54,750 in supplemental tax dollars are needed for the Street Fund. These dollars, when combined with other Street Fund revenues will help offset costs in areas such as maintenance personnel, minimal patchwork, street cleaning and sanding and snow removal. Passage of this measure is contingent upon passage of the separate "A" ballot for the City of Prineville being voted upon at this same election.

If this measure is approved, \$54,750 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year will be totally financed by local tax payers without any partial State payment.

Section 3. That the City Council deems it advisable and does hereby call and make the necessary provision for holding special elections which shall be and are hereby called to be held on the 20th day of September, 1983.

The electors voting at said special election shall cast ballots on the levies outside the present tax base in the sums of \$86,897, \$47,103, \$14,942, \$30,370, \$6,900, \$11,494, \$2,299 and \$54,750, which shall contain, in addition to the ballot titles, the words "_____ YES, I VOTE IN FAVOR OF THE LEVY: _____ NO, I VOTE AGAINST THE LEVY," and on which ballots each voter shall mark and cast according to law as each may desire to vote.

Section 4. The City Recorder be and he is hereby instructed to publish a notice of election in full with the ballot titles therefor once or oftener within the time period established by statute immediately preceding said special elections in the Central Oregonian, the official newspaper of the City, and hereby designated for said purposes, the first publication of said notice to be not less than ten (10) days prior to said election and by posting written notices of the proposed tax levies outside the present tax base in the sums of \$86,897, \$47,103, \$14,942, \$30,370, \$6,900, \$11,494, \$2,299 and \$54,750 for the fiscal year commencing


July 1, 1983 and ending June 30, 1984, in three public places: (1) Bulletin Board, City Hall; (2) Bulletin Board, U. S. Post Office, Prineville, and (3) Bulletin Board, Crook County Courthouse, Prineville, Oregon. The City Recorder shall make such arrangements with the Crook County Clerk as are necessary for the conduct of the election.
